Important Dates

SA QPR opens on July 1, 2017 in the Electronic Handbook (EHB)

The report is due on July 14, 2017





Tips for the Next QPR Submission

- Question 1A- report the <u>TOTAL</u> number of physicians with a DATA waiver as of the end of the reporting period. Do not limit the reported number to only new physicians with a DATA waiver added during the reporting period.
- Question 1B- report the <u>TOTAL</u> number of patients receiving MAT prescribed by a physician with a DATA waiver as of the end of the reporting period. Only report patients who receive MAT that is prescribed by a physician with a DATA waiver. Questions 1A and 1B are related.
- If you report zero for Question 1A or 1B- you must document your SA Service Expansion challenges and/or activities in the narrative Successes and Lessons Learned section of the report





Reasons your SA QPR may be returned

- 1. Data verification or corrections
  - If you report zero physicians with a DATA waiver for Question 1A, but you reported greater than zero physicians with a DATA waiver for the previous quarter
  - If you report zero for Question 1A, but report greater than zero for Question 1B
- 2. Additional information in the narrative needed
  - If you report zero for question 1A or 1B

- □ The July 2017 report will be your last SA QPR
- Grantees will report SA activities within EHB via UDS in the next UDS report cycle.
