What to Expect: This webinar will focus on the UDS patient demographic profile (ZIP Code Table and Tables 3A, 3B, and 4). This webinar will provide a clear overview of data collection and reporting requirements, highlight the importance of data governance and data hygiene, and offer strategies for leveraging this information, with an emphasis on integration of internal processes and systems-level preparedness to ensure effective and accurate data collection and reporting. This session is ideal for health center staff involved in UDS reporting and will help strengthen patient registration data collection, promote data integrity, and support impactful care delivery.

The webinar will discuss reporting strategies and opportunities for quality improvement. This session is ideal for clinical staff, quality improvement professionals, and data/reporting personnel responsible for UDS reporting.

The UDS PRE, accessible through the Electronic Handbooks (EHBs), allows health center awardees and look-alikes early access to prepare UDS data for submission. This session is ideal for data reporting staff who will be working directly within the EHBs.

What to Expect: This webinar will review the importance of UDS data collection and reporting, with a specific focus on assessing data for accuracy. The session will cover using available EHBs reports and tools (health center trend report, comparison tool, etc.), working through your review (data audit report, edits, how to use the EHBs system for review), and working with your reviewer for a successful submission. This session is ideal for data and reporting staff, quality improvement teams, and health center leadership involved in preparing, reviewing, and submitting accurate UDS reports.
