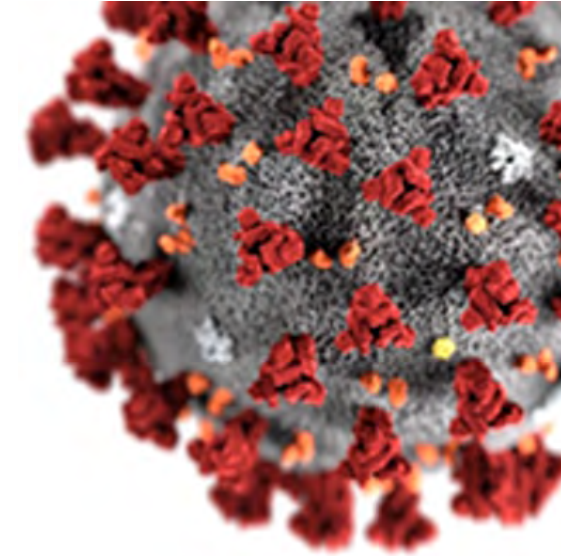

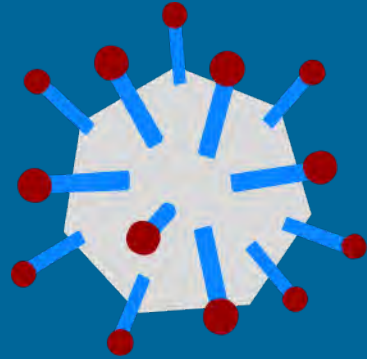


COVID-19 Vaccine Now Recommended for Ages 12+

- CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) voted to recommend the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 Vaccine for use in 12-15 year olds
- **COVID-19 Vaccine is now available for people ages 12+**
- COVID-19 vaccine can be co-administered simultaneously with other vaccines



Declines in Pediatric Vaccinations & Well-Visits



Declines in
**well-child visits and
immunizations**
during the COVID-19
pandemic



- **More missed well-child visits among:**
 - Low-income children
 - Black or Latinx/Hispanic children
- Greater immunization decline among **public sector** vaccine ordering

Well-child visits are opportunity for:

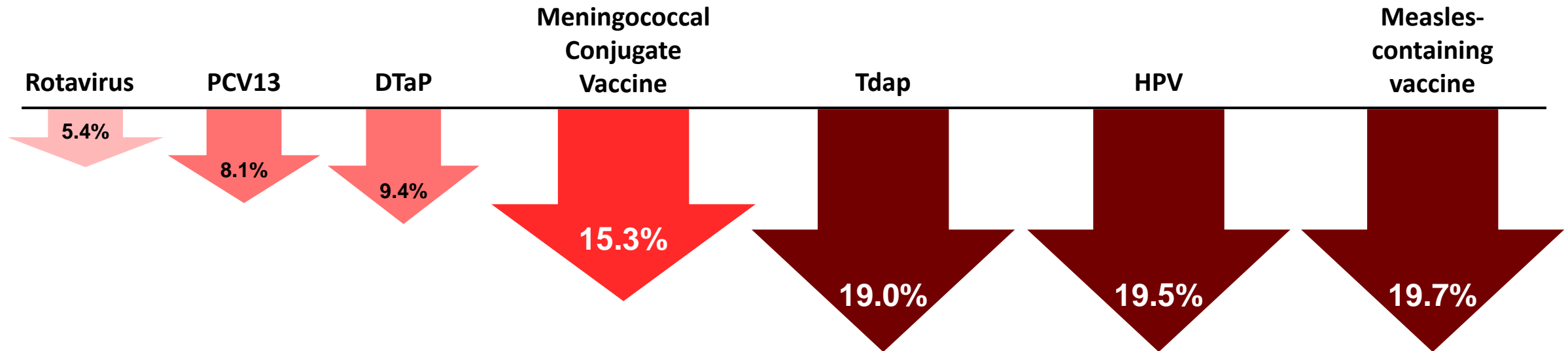
- Health assessment

COVID-19 Gaps in Routine Pediatric Vaccines

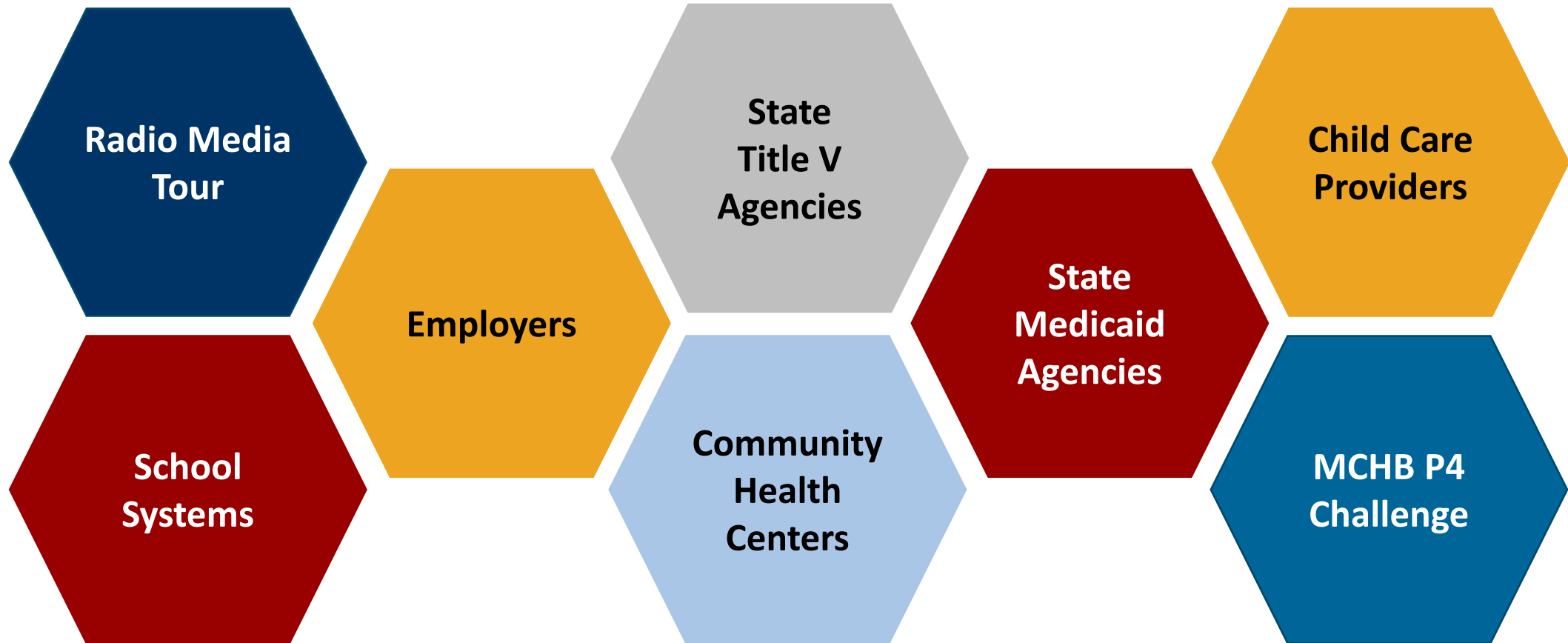
Compared to 2019,

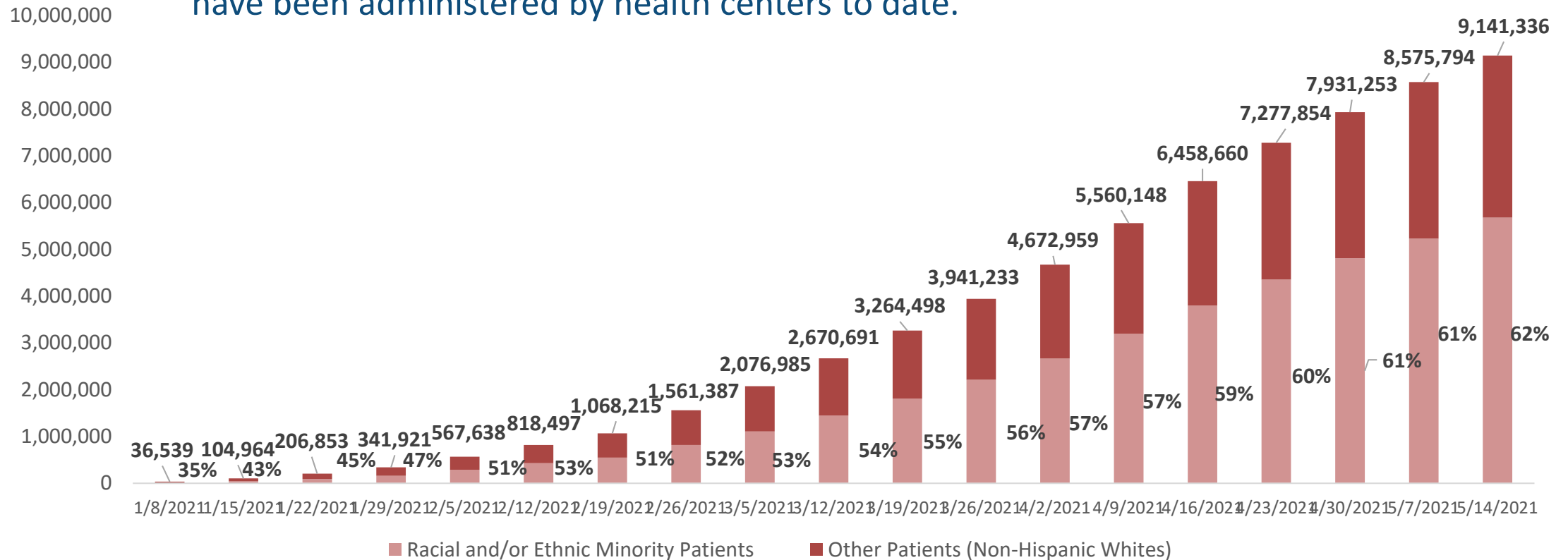

A total of 10,884,405 COVID-19 vaccine doses have been administered by health centers to date.

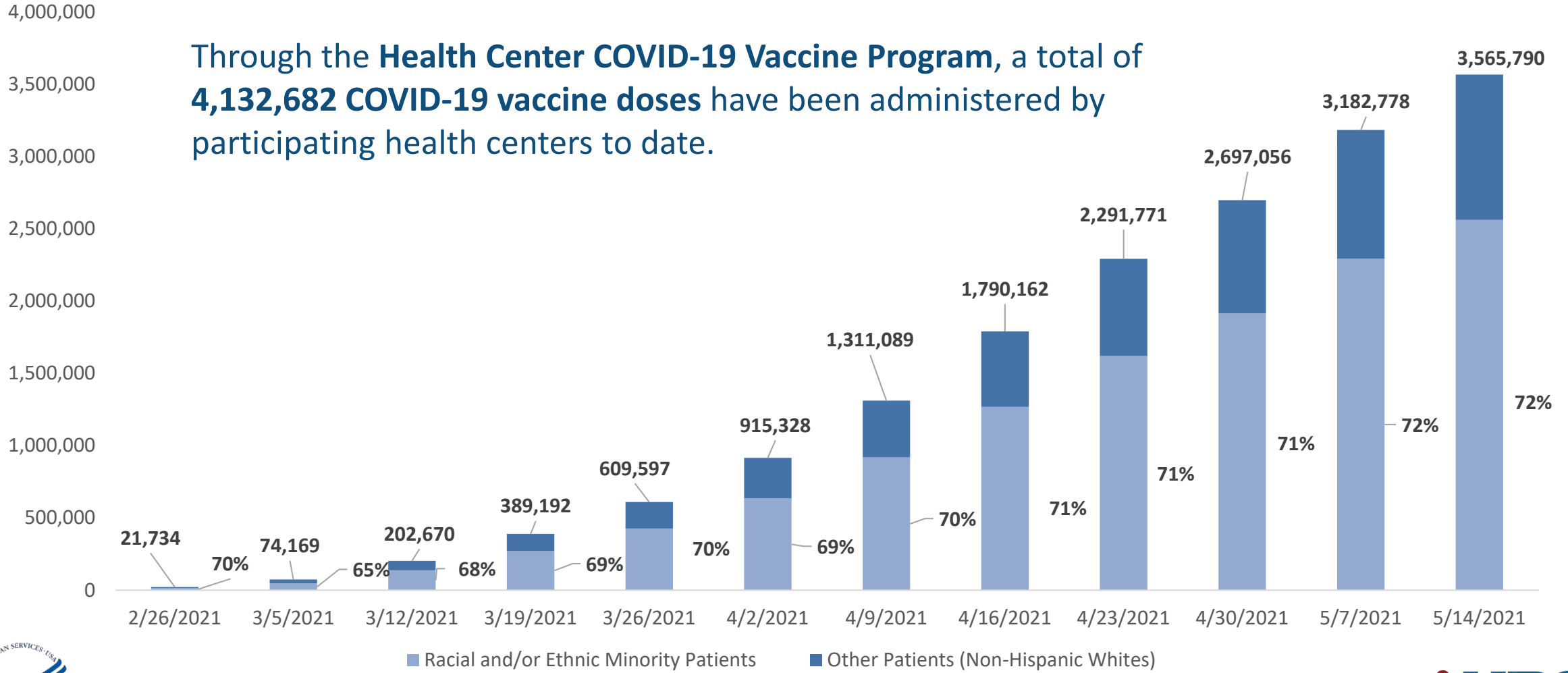

COVID-19 Vaccines Administered to Date by Health Centers: Race/Ethnicity Known - Vaccine Program



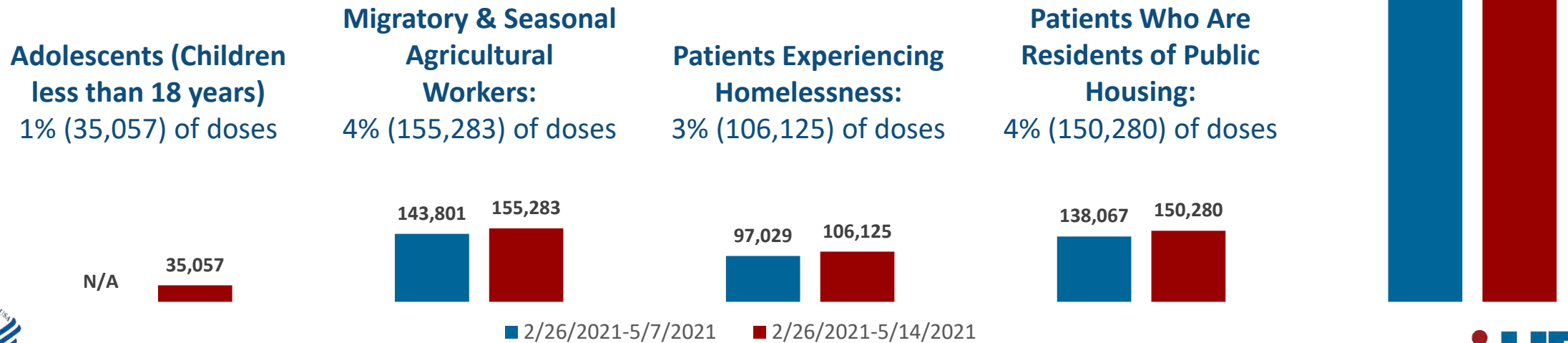

Through the **Health Center COVID-19 Vaccine Program**, a total of **3,694,360 COVID-19 vaccine doses** have been administered by participating health centers to date.

24% (1,006,743) of doses

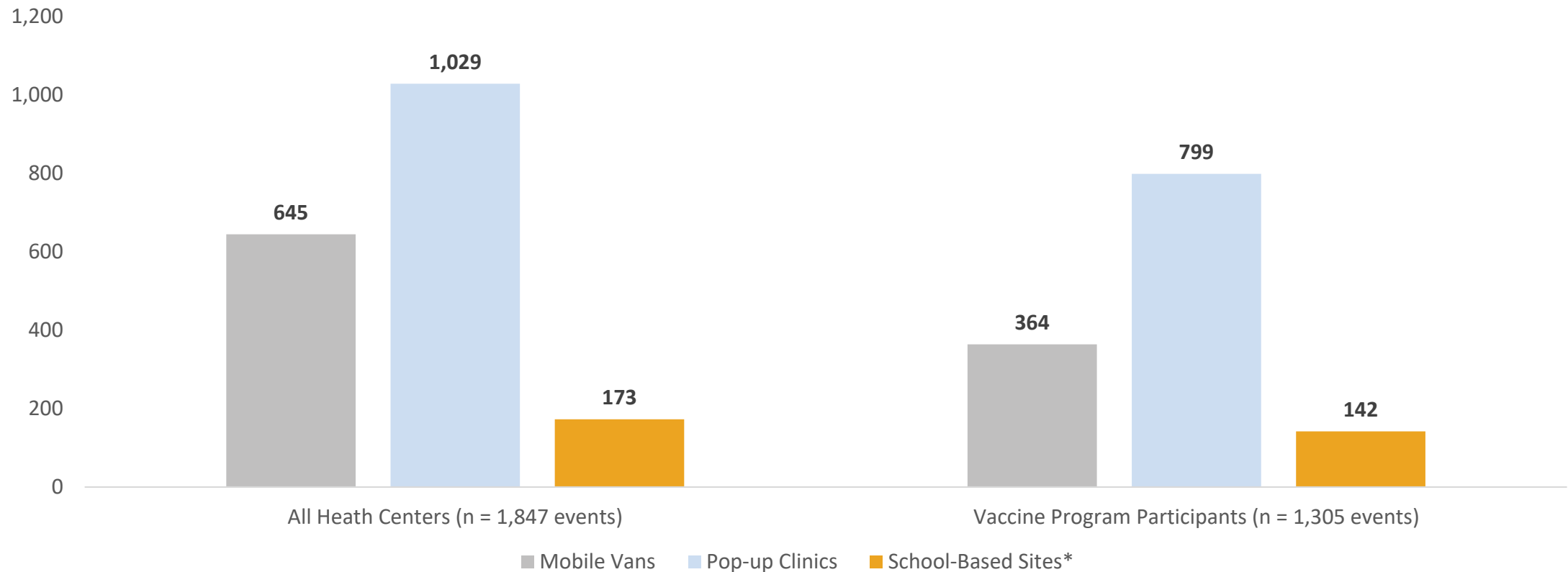

Community-Based Vaccination Efforts: Week Ending 5/14/2021

42% of all health centers and 48% of vaccine program participants used mobile vans or held pop up clinics to administer vaccines via a combined total of **1,847** community-based events last week.



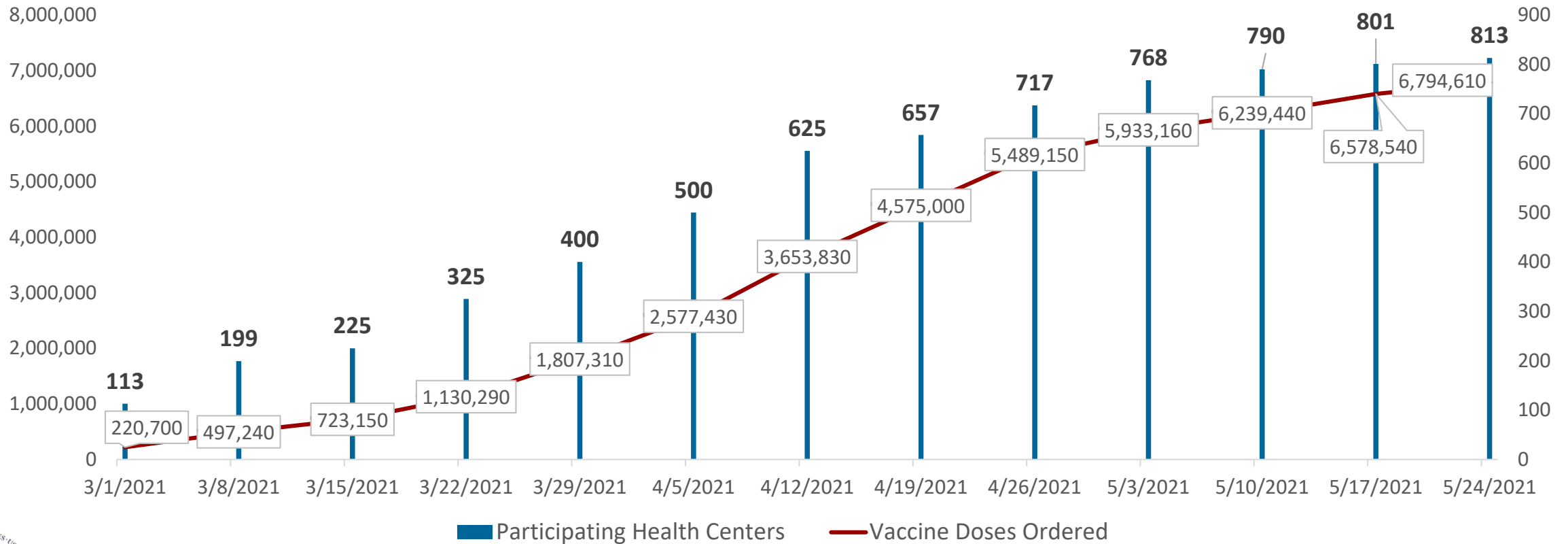

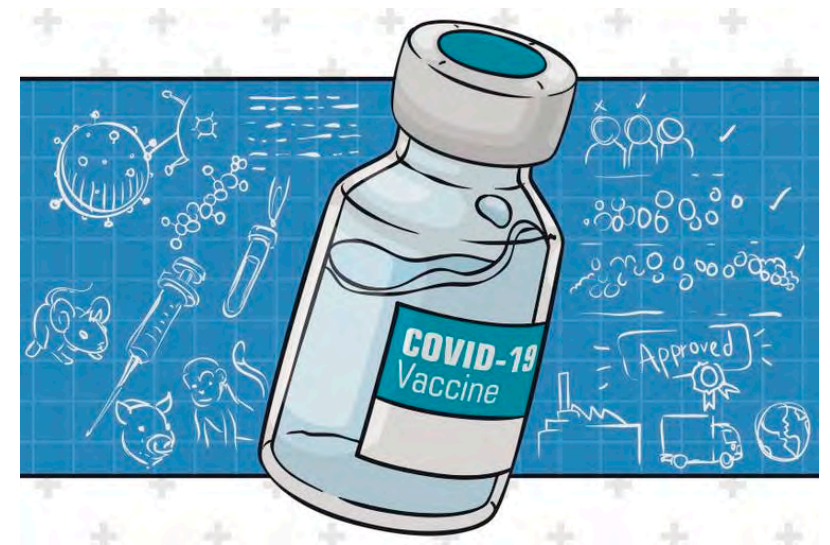

FTCA Redeeming Applications Due June 25

- The EHB System opened on April 23, 2021.
- Applications due on or before June 25, 2021, 11:59 p.m. ET, or the health center will have to reapply as an initial applicant and may be subject to a site visit prior to deeming approval.
- Visit the FTCA application process webpage for Technical Assistance Tools:
 - Program Assistance Letter – Overview of the application process and guidance for submitting your application.
 - Technical Assistance Recordings (Deeming Overview, Volunteer Health Professionals, Risk Management, National Practitioner Data Bank).
 - FTCA Application Demonstrating Compliance Tool Kit (sample Risk Management Training Plan, Annual Risk Management Report to the Board, Credentialing and Privileging Compliance Tool, etc.).
