CDC Bridge Access Program

- CDC will buy COVID-19 vaccines and distribute them through state and local health department (S/LHD) immunization programs
- Health centers need to enroll as a 317 adult immunization provider with their S/LHD immunization program to request free Bridge vaccines for uninsured and underinsured adults

- CDC will also contract with pharmacies so they can continue offering COVID-19
 vaccines and designated treatments with no out-of-pocket costs to uninsured
 and underinsured adults





Funding Purpose and Overview





Purpose

Support health centers to continue essential COVID-19-related services and mitigate adverse impacts of COVID-19 on underserved populations








Award Information

New award (H8L) One-time funding from American Rescue Plan 16-month period of performance (September 1, 2023 through December 31, 2024) More than \$81 million total funding 1,463 awards





Funding Formula







Allowable Activities



- COVID-19 testing
- COVID-19 vaccination
- COVID-19 therapeutics
- Enabling/patient support services to support COVID-19-related services
- COVID-19 Vaccine

- Community COVID-19 vaccination events
- Personnel who support COVID-19-related services and care delivery
- Supplies that support COVID-19-related services and care delivery

May support costs back to June 1, 2023, if aligned with the allowable activities and necessary for efficient and timely performance of Bridge activities





Ineligible Costs

- Costs not aligned with the Bridge funding purpose
- Costs already paid for by any other federal awards, including H80, H8F, H8G and L2C funding
- Costs that are reimbursed or compensated by other federal or state programs
- Equipment purchases
- Construction and alteration/renovation projects
- Facility or land purchases





Post-Award Submission, Reporting, and Technical Assistance





Post-Award Submission

1. SF-424A Budget Information Form

- Complete in EHBs
- Include costs for the entire 16-month period of performance

2. Budget Narrative

- Align with SF-424A
- Include personnel table with 16-month salary
- Provide Allowable Activities Chart

Due in EHBs by October 2, 2023





Budget Narrative: Allowable Activities Chart

Allowable Activities	Indicate "Yes" for the activities you will conduct with Bridge funding
COVID-19 Testing	
COVID-19 Vaccination	
COVID-19 Therapeutics	
Enabling/patient support services (such as outreach, education, enrollment assistance, transportation, translation, and care coordination) to support COVID-19 related services	
Community COVID-19 vaccination events	
Personnel who support COVID-19 related services and care delivery, including personnel costs necessary to develop, support, or expand collaborations, including collaborations with state/jurisdiction immunization programs	
Supplies that support COVID-19-related services and care delivery	



Making the Most of Your Funding

Vaccines, therapeutics, and testing supplies are available through:

- CDC's Bridge Access Program for COVID-19 Vaccines
- CDC's Vaccines for Children Program
- HRSA's <u>COVID-19 Therapeutics Program</u>
- HRSA's COVID-19 Testing Supply Program

You must make every reasonable effort to get COVID-19 vaccines, therapeutics, and testing supplies through these HHS programs.





Reasonable Efforts and Unmet Need Documentation

- If you use Bridge funding on vaccines, therapeutics, or testing supplies, you must document:
 - The unmet need in your community
 - Your reasonable efforts to get these supplies from the HHS programs
- For example, document:
 - If you applied and were denied participation in these programs, or
 - If they do not provide a sufficient or timely supply of vaccines, therapeutics, or testing supplies to meet the anticipated needs of your patient population
- Do not submit this documentation with your Bridge post-award submission
 - HRSA may request it later, so keep it on file





Reporting Requirements

- Respond to the Health Center COVID-19 Survey until it ends
- Complete periodic progress reports and a final report
- Report COVID-19 testing and vaccination data through the UDS


