


Current Investments



Purpose

- Improve developmental outcomes among children served by health centers
- Increase the number of **developmental screenings** for children ages 0-5
- Increase access to appropriate follow-up services, as needed
- Build ECD expertise into care teams

Increase the number of children ages 0-5 who receive recommended developmental screenings

Increase the number of children and their families assisted with accessing appropriate follow-up services within 30 days of a developmental screening identifying an area of concern

Population health and healthrelated social needs



Review Application

- Work Plan
 - Activity Area
 - Activity
 - Timeframe
- Budget
 - Summary and categories
 - Narrative
- For approved equipment
 - Costs limited to year 1 only
 - Cannot exceed \$150,000 total







Scope Adjustments and Changes in Scope

- If needed, submit a scope adjustment or change in scope to implement your project
- HRSA must approve all scope changes before implementation
- Guidance available on the <u>Scope of Project resource webpage</u>







Consider Budgeting Guidance


- ECD funding falls under expanded authority
- Prior approval needed:
 - Significant rebudgeting of project costs
 - Equipment <u>not</u> previously approved
- Direct all questions to the GMS listed on your Notice of Award

Purchase and/or installation of trailers and pre-fabricated modular units



EHRs that are not ONC certified



Minor alterations and renovations; new construction



Costs not related to the ECD purpose

- Year 1 progress on activities
- Year 2 budget and updated work plan
- Year 1 assistance with follow-up data measure
- All required to review/approve Year 2 funding

Semi-Annual Progress Reports (SAPRs)

- Project Status
- Accomplishments and barriers

Uniform Data System (UDS)

- Developmental screening measure
- Calendar-year data

Assistance with Follow-Up Data Measure

Year 2 collection as part of the semi-annual progress report

Funding Beyond 2-Year Period of Performance

Possibility of ongoing funding beyond year 2, dependent on:

- Progress on screening objective measured through 2024 UDS data
- Progress on assisting with follow-up objective measured through Non-Competing Continuation (NCC) and Assistance with Follow-Up Data Report
- Availability of appropriated funds
- Decision that continued funding is in the best interest of the federal government




