Award Summary





Ending the HIV Epidemic in the U.S.

75% reduction in new HIV infections in 5 years and at least 90% reduction in 10 years.



Diagnose all people with HIV as early as possible.

Treat the infection rapidly and effectively to achieve sustained viral suppression.





Prevent new HIV transmissions by using proven interventions, including pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) and syringe services programs (SSPs).

Respond quickly to potential HIV outbreaks to get needed prevention and treatment services to people who need them.





Next Steps: Overview

Review your application

Read your PCHP notice of award

Consider program conditions and budget guidance, and submit adjustments, as needed

Submit scope adjustment or change in scope requests, as needed





Notice of Award (NoA)

- Terms describe your responsibilities with PCHP funding
- May include budget conditions
 - Program Grants management specialist may contact you with instructions for addressing budget conditions
 - Must respond within 30 days of award
- May include program conditions
- Reporting requirements
- Provides contact information for:
 - Program contact (contact via the <u>BPHC Contact Form</u>)
 - Grants management specialist (GMS)





Re-Budgeting

- You may re-budget without prior approval, provided use supports PCHP purpose and objectives
- Prior approval is required for equipment not previously approved
 - Cannot exceed \$150,000 total per year
- This program falls under expanded authority
- Direct questions to the GMS listed on the NoA
- See <u>PCHP Instructions Appendix B</u> for example uses of funding





Ineligible Costs



Costs already supported with Health Center Program funding



Facility or land purchases; installing trailers or modular units



Vehicle purchases (mobile units are allowed)



EHRs that are not ONC certified



Minor alterations and renovations; new construction



Prohibited syringe services program costs





Scope Adjustments and Changes in Scope

- May need a scope adjustment or change in scope to implement your project
- HRSA must approve all scope changes before implementation
- Guidance available on the <u>Scope of Project resource webpage</u>

HIV prevention services are part of general primary medical care, not a Form 5A service category of its own




