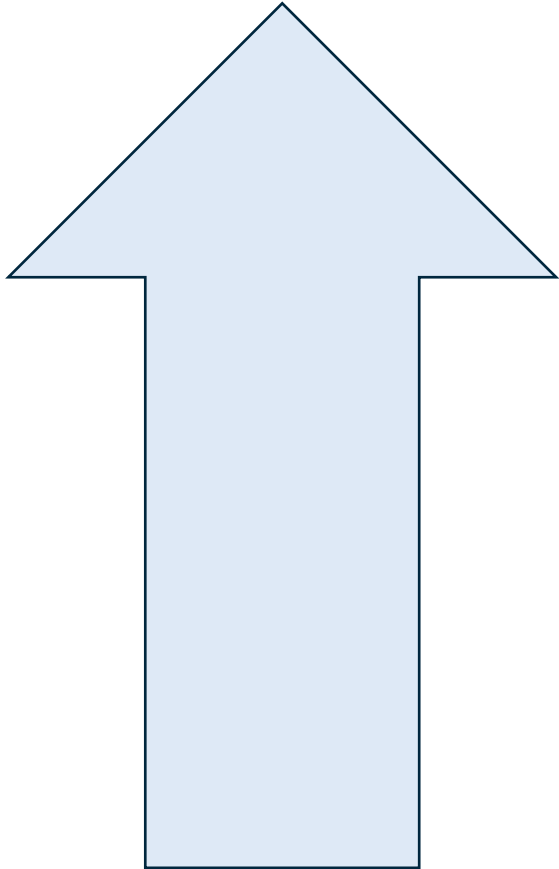

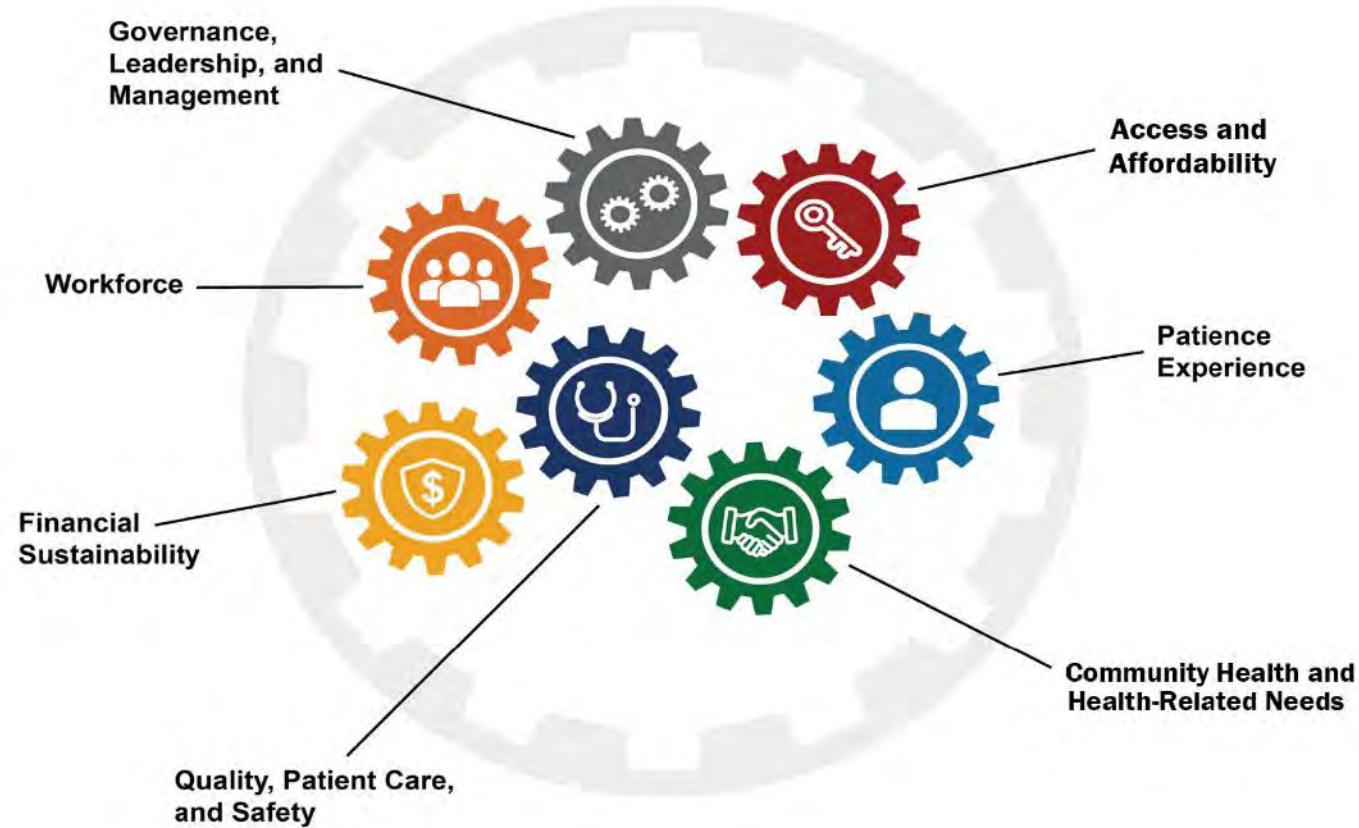

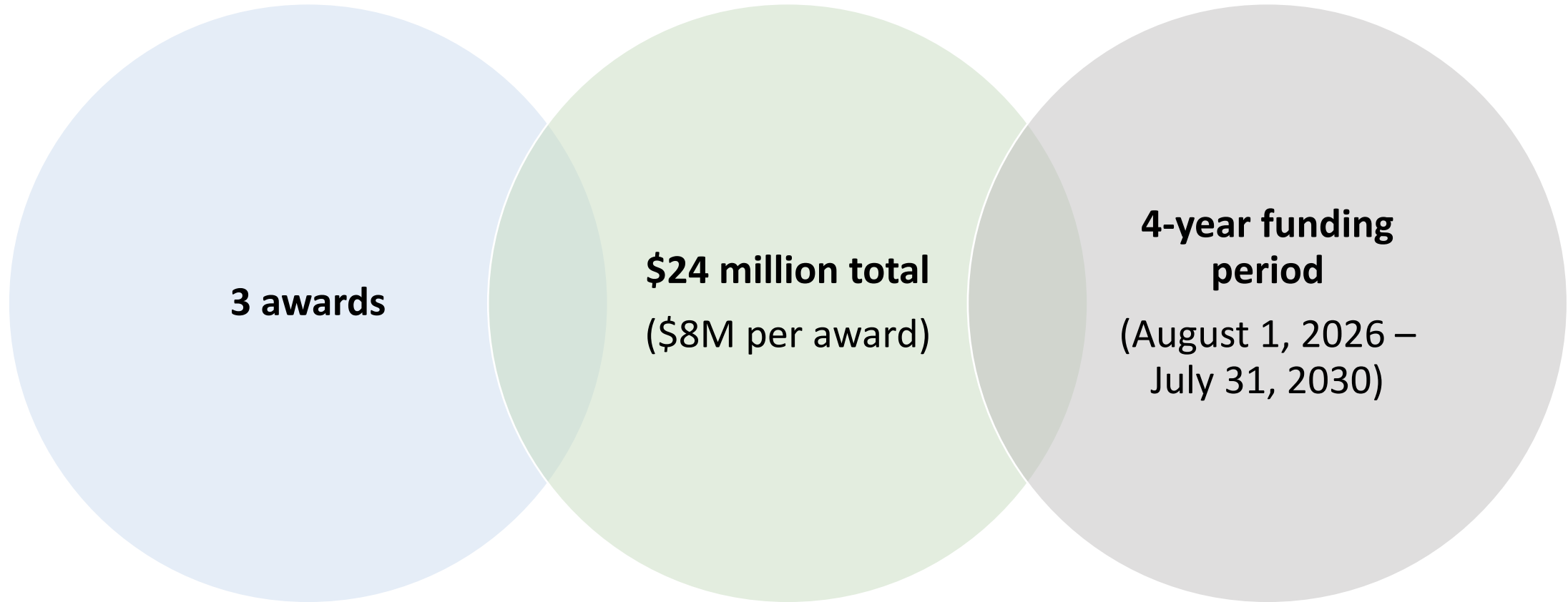
Health Center Performance Improvement Framework

Eligible

- Domestic organizations (in the United States, DC, territories, and freely associated states) that are:
 - Non-profits
 - For profits
 - Public entities
 - State, county, city, township, and special district governments
 - Public and private institutions of higher education
 - Native American tribal governments and organizations

Not Eligible

- Individuals
- Foreign organizations

Other Considerations



You may apply for only 1 NTAP category:

- Clinical and Preventive Excellence
- Operational Excellence
- National TA and Coordination Center

Your application must:

- Demonstrate your understanding of national needs
- Show your experience and ability to conduct learning opportunities for health centers
- Explain how you will identify best practices that improve the quality, efficiency, and effectiveness of TA
- Identify organizations you will collaborate with to make sure you have the right subject matter expertise



TA Formats



National audiences

General, short-term, and didactic sessions that address priority needs of many health centers.

National community of practice (CoP)

Regular interaction of small groups that include peer learning to address a specific topic and area of need.

Outcomes-focused cohorts

Intensive, targeted one-on-one support and peer learning for health centers to improve clinical or operational performance.

 - Application page limit is 80 pages

NOFO Sections and Scoring



Project Work Plan: Logistics



- Submit as an attachment
 - Does **not** count for the page limit
- Be sure your text is in the print area, and that the page layout makes the plan easy to read
- Tips:
 - Use only 2 columns
 - Format to fit the width of a page in portrait layout

Project Work Plan: Content and Reminders



Objectives Section

- 8 or 13 required objectives
- Use title and description from NOFO
- Set target (number or percentage for end of 4-year period of performance)
- Write impact narrative

Activities Section

- At least 1 activity section per objective – add more as needed
- State TA format, performance domains, and partners
- Describe activity
- Provide additional details

Your PWP should:

- ✓ Set realistic and achievable targets
- ✓ Include the required numbers of activities, participants, and sessions
- ✓ Describe year 1 activities only

SF-424A: Budget Information Form



- **Section A:** Enter year 1 federal funding requested (maximum \$8M)
- **Section B:** Year 1 breakdown by object class categories
- **Section C:** Leave blank
- **Section D:** Leave blank or breakdown year 1 by quarter
- **Section E:** Use the first 3 columns to enter your outyear annual funding (year 2 in the first column, year 3 in the second column, and year 4 in the third column)
- **Section F:** Enter your indirect cost rate type (provisional, predetermined, final, fixed, or *de minimis*) and explain any out-of-the-ordinary direct costs

Detailed line-item budget



Outlines and explains all federal expenses



Covers each year of the 4-year period of performance



Year 1 breakdown consistent with the SF-424A, Section B



Includes a staff justification table



Ineligible Costs



Costs already paid for by any other federal awards



Costs not aligned with the NTAP purpose (e.g., direct patient care)



Construction, alteration and renovation (A/R), or expansions



Reserve requirements for state insurance licensure



Support for lobbying or advocacy efforts



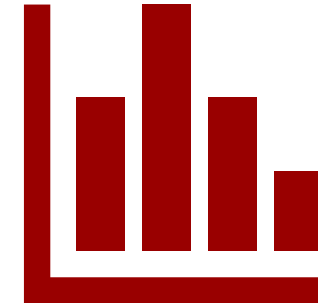

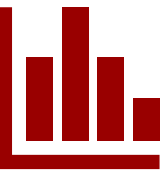

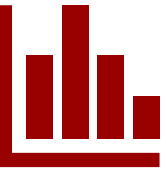
Reporting



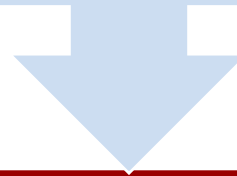
- **Federal Financial Report**
 - Annual accounting of expenditures
- **Non-Competing Continuation (NCC)**
 - Informed by the project work plan
 - Completed during years 1, 2, and 3
 - Describes progress
 - Provides updated plans and budget for the next year
- **Final Report**
 - Cumulative progress on meeting each objective target
 - Lessons learned
 - Final data

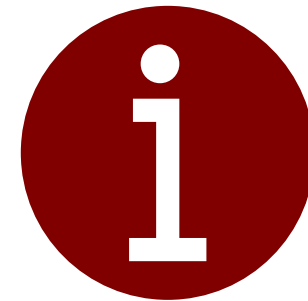
