

Funding Opportunity Overview







Background



Need

 82.5 million adults live with a mental health condition or substance use disorder (SUD)

Access

- 98% of health centers serve patients with mental health conditions, 83% serve those with SUDs
- 7.6 million patients still need mental health services, 4.7 million need SUD services







Award Purpose and Summary



Purpose

- Increase access to behavioral health services through starting or expanding:
 - Mental health services and
 - SUD services

Eligibility

 Health Center Program award recipients with active H80 grant

- Estimated Awards: 400
- Award Amounts
 - Year 1: \$600,000
 - Year 2: \$500,000
- Period of Performance:
 September 1, 2024, to
 August 31, 2026 (2 years)
- New Grant Number: H8N





Objectives

We require treatment services for both objectives



You must propose to use BHSE funds to achieve two objectives: Increase the number of patients receiving mental health services

Increase the number of patients receiving SUD services, including treatment with medications for opioid use disorder (MOUD)




