Requirement Reminders

Conduct outreach and engage patients with uncontrolled hypertension

Fully participate in training and technical assistance (T/TA) activities

NHCI-HC

Ensure access to, and support use of, Bluetooth or wireless-enabled self-monitored blood pressure (SMBP) devices, and use their data to inform hypertension treatment plans

Collect and share data to support participate in initiative evaluation and reporting activities





Important Dates

• When does my project period end?

The project period end date is the same for all NHCI awardee recipients and is December 31, 2023. You have until this date to complete your HRSA-approved work plan.

• When does my H80 budget period end?

- NHCI budget periods vary by health center.
- NHCI funds may be utilized through the end of your fiscal year 2023 budget period, with HRSA approved carryover, if needed.
- Know your H80 budget period and the exact January 2021 Notice of Award release date.
- Contact your H80 grants management specialist if you have additional questions.





Beyond the Project End Date

- Do I need to submit a Progress Report after December 31, 2022?
 - Yes, the last Progress Report submission in EHBs will begin on January 1, 2024.
- Do I need to submit a prior approval carryover request for unspent NHCI funds?
 - Since the NHCI funding is part of the overall H80 grant, if the total unobligated balance is less than 25% of the total H80 award, you may carry over the funds without submitting a prior approval carryover request. Include the NHCI balance as a line item in your Federal Financial Report.
- Can I request a no-cost extension for NHCI funds?
 - A no-cost extension for NHCI funding is not an option due to the funding being part of the overall H80 grant.
- Contact your H80 grants management specialist
 - Additional questions about expanded authority or a no-cost extension.





Other Reminders

• Patient majority requirement

 Your patient majority is based on your 2019 UDS total number of patients or your 2020 data to date from your electronic health record (EHR) universe (controlled and uncontrolled) listed in your original application/work plan (+1)

• Your health center's national T/TA group assignment

- Group 1 American Heart Association
- Group 2 Altarum

• T/TA attendance requirement

- At least one T/TA event per reporting period
- Includes those offered by HRSA and HRSA's national partners, CDC's SMBP Forum/Million Hearts, or NACHC
- Listening to past webinar recordings is acceptable
