- Provide updates on activities from July 1, 2022 December 31, 2022
- The questions will be similar to prior NHCI Progress Reports, with a few minor updates to question format





Updates – NHCI-HC Progress Report Form

- Question 2 (each sub question) and Question 4 will now include a separate textbox to include Successes/Promising Practices and Lessons Learned
 - Successes / Promising Practices: Discuss what has worked well or any positive outcomes resulting from the project during this reporting period. Also, use this space to describe best or promising practices, as applicable, and include any supporting data, if available
 - Lessons Learned: Describe any knowledge gained from the process of conducting or implementing the project during this reporting period. This includes positive and negative experiences

Patient majority requirement

- This number is calculated from the 2019 UDS total or your 2020 data to date from your EHR universe provided as part of your work plan in your original application. This is not your current total number of patients with hypertension
- Please revisit your patient majority number to ensure you are on track with making SMBP devices available to the correct number of patients
- Your health center's national T/TA group assignment
 - Group 1 American Heart Association
 - Group 2 Altarum Institute

• T/TA attendance requirement

- At least one T/TA event per reporting period
- Includes those offered by HRSA, and HRSA's national partners, such as CDC's SMBP Forum/Million Hearts, or NACHC
- Listening to past webinar recordings acceptable
