About the Health Center Program

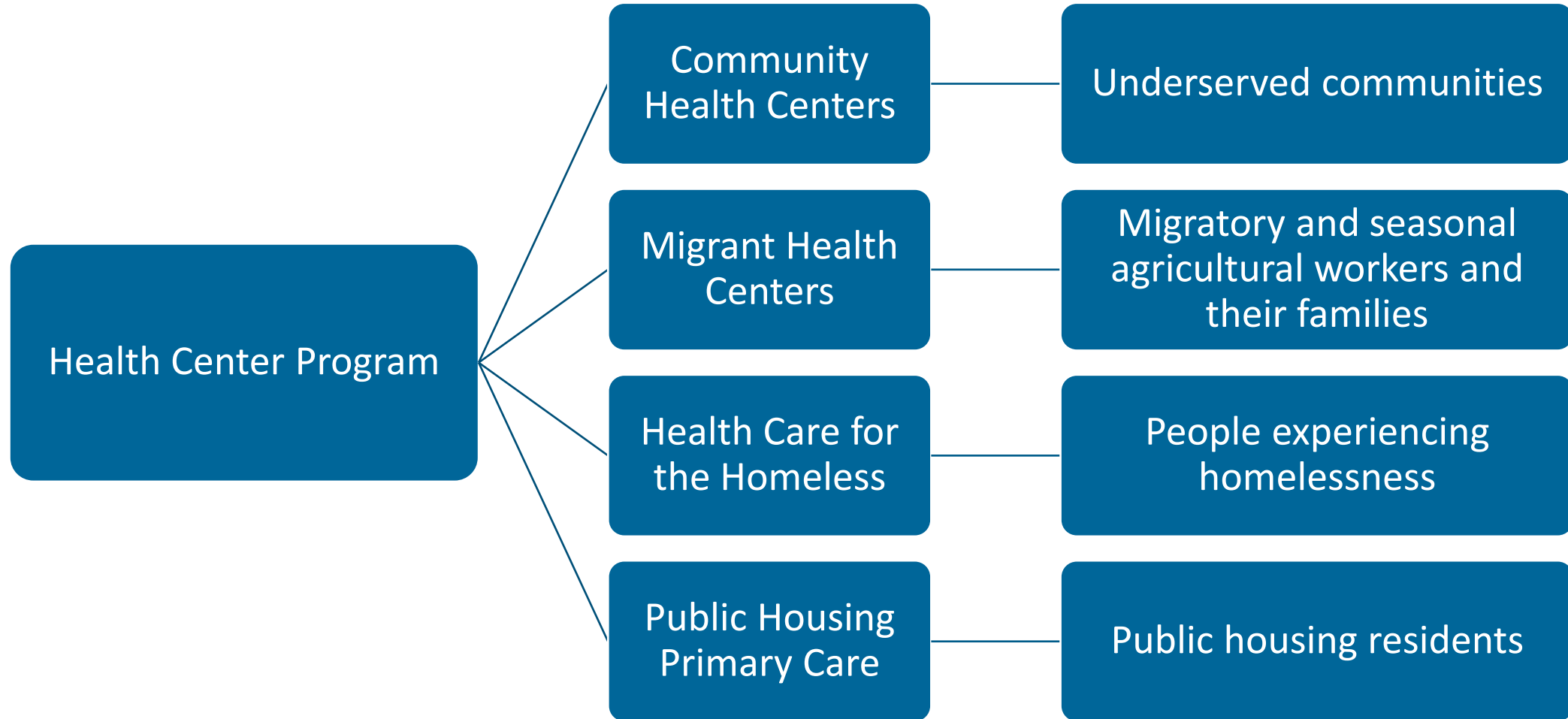


- **Community-based and patient-directed** organizations

- Serve more than **30.5 million** patients, including:
 - 1 in 9 children
 - 1.4 million people experiencing homelessness
 - More than 9.6 million people in rural areas

Health Center Types/Populations



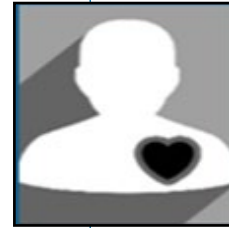

Purpose of NAP Funding



To support new health care service delivery sites to expand affordable, accessible, and high-quality primary health care for underserved communities and populations.

Types of NAP Applicants



New Starts

- Not a Health Center Program award recipient or look-alike

Look-Alikes

- Currently a Health Center Program look-alike

Satellites

- Currently a Health Center Program award recipient (H80 funding)

Should You Apply for NAP?



Requirements

- Propose at least 1 new, full-time service site (current look-alike sites count)
- Plan to open sites within 120 days of award
- Work to be compliant with all Health Center Program requirements within 120 days of award

Opportunities

- \$650,000 in grant funding
- Health Center Program benefits
- You define your service area

Challenges

- Very competitive
- Sites must be open within 8 months
- Lack of compliance impacts future funding
