Key PCHP Project Requirements



Purpose of PCHP Funding

To expand HIV prevention services that decrease the risk of HIV transmission in geographic locations identified by [Ending the HIV Epidemic: A Plan for America](#), focusing on supporting access to and use of pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP).



Impact of PCHP Project

Staffing Impact

- Minimum 0.5 FTE increase by **November 30, 2020**
- Added staff must support access to and use of PrEP

Patient Impact

- Increase number of patients tested for HIV
- Increase access to PrEP
- Link HIV positive patients to treatment

PCHP Progress

Progress toward increasing access to PrEP and achieving the minimum 0.5 FTE staffing increase will be monitored via your responses to the Triannual Progress Reporting updates.

Important: HRSA may not award Year 2 PCHP funding if increased access to PrEP is not demonstrated, or the staffing requirement is not met by November 30, 2020.

PCHP Progress Report Measures



Question 1: PCHP Personnel

Q1: Enter the number of FTEs by major service category that were hired and/or contracted by the health center to support HIV prevention services from 3/1/2020 to the end of the reporting period.

- Report only FTEs supported by PCHP supplemental funding.
- This data measure aligns with *UDS Table 5: Staffing and Utilization* in the [2020 UDS Manual](#).

Question 1: Staffing Positions (Example)

Example:

During the current reporting period, you hired a new provider (1.0 FTE) that will only be partially supported with the PCHP funding (0.5 FTE for that provider).

- You will enter 0.5 FTE for that provider, since 50% of their salary will be supported with the PCHP funding.
- In the next reporting period, as long as PCHP funding supported 50% of their salary, you will reenter 0.5 FTE for this provider.



Question 2 (a-e): HIV Testing

2a. Report the number of health center visits during which an HIV test was performed from 3/1/2020 to the end of the current reporting period, regardless of funding source.	This measure should reflect your overall health center effort in providing HIV services and not just the activities associated with the PCHP funding.	This data measure aligns with <i>UDS Table 6A: Selected Diagnoses and Services Rendered, Line 21, Column a</i> in the 2020 UDS Manual .
2b. Report the number of patients tested for HIV from 3/1/2020 to the end of the current reporting period, regardless of funding source.	This measure should reflect your overall health center effort in providing HIV services and not just the activities associated with the PCHP funding.	This data measure aligns with <i>UDS Table 6A: Selected Diagnoses and Services Rendered, Line 21, Column b</i> in the 2020 UDS Manual .
2c. Report the number of patients with a documented HIV test performed between the ages of 15 and 65 years, from 3/1/2020 to the end of the current reporting period, regardless of funding source.	This measure should reflect your overall health center effort in providing HIV services and not just the activities associated with the PCHP funding.	This is a new data measure for CY 2020 UDS reporting. This data measure aligns with <i>UDS Table 6B: Quality of Care Measures, Line 20a, Column c</i> in the 2020 UDS Manual .
2d. Report the number of new HIV diagnoses made, from 3/1/2020 to the end of the current reporting period, regardless of funding source.	This measure should reflect your overall health center effort in providing HIV services and not just the activities associated with the PCHP funding.	This data measure aligns with <i>UDS Table 6B: Quality of Care Measures, Line 20, Column a</i> in the 2020 UDS Manual .
2e. Report the number of patients newly diagnosed with HIV who were seen for follow up treatment within 30 days of diagnosis, from 3/1/2020 to the end of the current reporting period, regardless of funding source.	This measure should reflect your overall health center effort in providing HIV services and not just the activities associated with the PCHP funding.	This is a revised data measure for CY 2020 UDS reporting. This data measure aligns with <i>UDS Table 6B: Quality of Care Measures, Line 20, Column c</i> in the 2020 UDS Manual .



Question 3: HIV PrEP Prescriptions

Q3: Report all HIV negative patients who received a PrEP prescription from 3/1/2020 to the end of the current reporting period, regardless of funding source.

- This measure should reflect your overall health center effort in providing PrEP and not just the activities associated with the PCHP funding.
- This is a new data measure for CY 2020 UDS reporting.
- The measure aligns with the UDS Table 6A: Selected Services Rendered, Line 21e, Column b in the [2020 UDS Manual](#).

Question 4: Partnership, Outreach, and Engagement

Q4: Describe the partnerships developed and outreach efforts your health center engaged in through the provision of HIV prevention, education, testing, linkage to care, and other services during the current reporting period.

- This measure should reflect your overall health center effort in developing partnerships and conducting outreach related to PCHP.
