Key PCHP Project Requirements



Purpose of PCHP Funding

To expand HIV prevention services that decrease the risk of HIV transmission in geographic locations identified by [Ending the HIV Epidemic in the US \(EHE\) Initiative](#), focusing on supporting access to and use of pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP).
